Keep it clean, simple and uncluttered

How do you style a penthouse in a tall residential tower? Well, we had enough time to think while travelling the lift in an 18-storey tower and the answer was simple – let the architecture and the views do all the talking.

For this apartment we chose to go with a modern scheme that echoes with the clean lines of the interior. Classic pieces with lots of stainless steel are elegantly understated.

In the media room we painted a wall in a light metallic grey, used dark occasional chairs and warm mood lighting to make this area feel cosy

and inviting, perfect for watching a movie. In the main lounge area we used a bright army green sofa complemented with metallic and silver cushions to add a bit of bling.

The dining area needed to tie in with the kitchen, so we choose to make it all white.

The white leather chairs and 2-pac table top are two more textures added to the room, albeit subtle ones. The room is now a symphony of white and metallics, bought to life by the centrepiece – the sofa. All were designed to add to the space rather than detract from it.
